A fan is not a man.


Tom is on the mat.

Illustrate the story here:




The hen sits in the big hut. The hog sees the hut. The hog asks the hen if he can sit in the hut.

Illustrate the story here:




Gil is in a big lab. Gil got lost in the big lab. The lamp in the lab is not on. Gil can not see. “Help!” said Gil.

Illustrate the story here:




Glen and Al are slugs. Glen and Al are pals. Al can not run. Glen can not trot. Glen and Al are not fast.

Gil and His Pig


Illustrate the story here:

Illustrate the story here:




Glen is a frog with black spots. Glen is in the pond. The pond has pads. Glen can jump from pad to pad. He can flip and flop on the pads in the pond.

Illustrate the story here:




Brent and Clint must get Mom a gift. The kids went to Gram's Craft Stand.

Illustrate the story here:





Illustrate the story here:




Phil and Whit went on a walk. On a whim, they went to see Steph. She could whip them up a snack. She was a whiz with a whisk.

Illustrate the story here:





Illustrate the story here:



Illustrate the story here:





Illustrate the story here:


